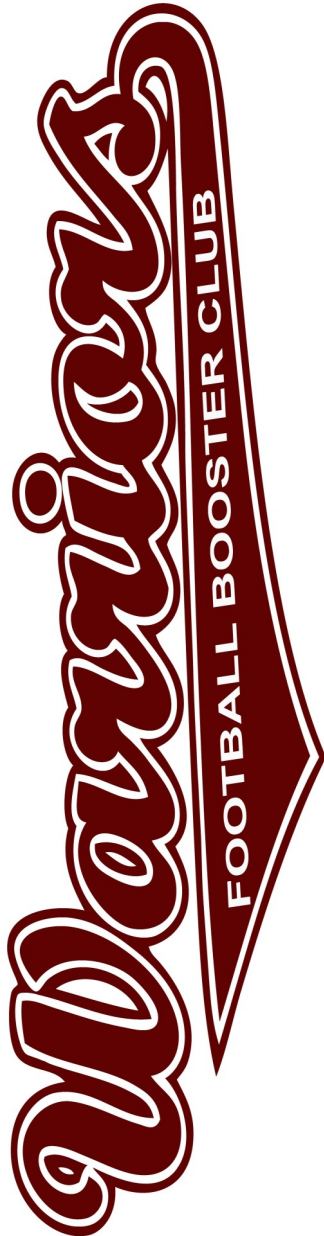


Warriors Are Built Not Born
